This devotional focuses on:

6. Lust for Power—lust for the ability to command people, resources, like little toy soldiers on a worldwide field.

Power is almost a mystical quality in that you really cannot observe who has the real power unless you know that they are responsible and take ownership of the results of the wielding of that power. With Christians, the problem with power is either due to the lack of knowledge, we do not know the power we have. Or we do not know who we are in Christ? Or we do not know Who resides in us? If you know all of this, then my question to you is: Why do you not attempt to use it? "Then Jesus answering said unto them, Go your way, and tell John what things ye have seen and heard; how that the blind see, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, to the poor the gospel is preached." Luke 7:22 Is Jesus really inside of you? Is your church doing this? Are you doing this?

On the other hand, <u>evil knows its power</u>, its limits, and how little Christians know about the power they have and how we can use that power to overcome evil (Hear: satan and his followers—some who realize they are his followers and others who do not realize they are serving him.), the world (Hear: worldliness and covetousness.), and ourselves (Hear: our SELFs.).

When you think of evil, most people think of satan, not those he uses for his purposes. He will elevate people who are disbelievers in Jesus and in satan and in God. They will become presidents of countries, CEOs of corporations, Supreme Courts, state governments and the like. He does this so he can change laws, create institutions, and use available media outlets to not only persuade people but motivate them and get them to look the other way while some devilish plot can take hold. These situations and circumstances begin their execution before the population can imagine the results, integration, or negative provisions within. Think political correctness and its ties to Roman pluralism and the Illuminati.

There are many who seek after money, not just for what money can bring. They seek money because with money they can be positioned into a seat of power. With money they can position themselves with others with money, like-minded others whose goals are power and domination over those without money or the means to make money.
